Disqualification Under Anti-Defection Law

Why in News?

Recently, the Jharkhand Assembly Speaker disqualified two legislators under the <u>Anti-Defection</u> Law.

Key Points

- Both the legislators have been found guilty of defection under the <u>10th Schedule of the Constitution</u>.
- Anti-Defection Law
 - The anti-defection law punishes individual Members of <u>Parliament</u> (MPs)/<u>Members of the Legislative</u> <u>Assembly (MLAs)</u> for leaving one party for another.
 - Parliament added it to the Constitution as the Tenth Schedule in 1985 in order to bring stability to governments by discouraging legislators from changing parties.
 - The Tenth Schedule popularly known as the Anti-Defection Act - was included in the Constitution via the 52nd Amendment Act, 1985.
 - It sets the provisions for the disqualification of elected members on the grounds of defection to another political party.
 - It was a response to the toppling of multiple state governments by party-hopping MLAs after the general elections of 1967.

Mukhyamantri Behan-Beti Swavalamban Protsahan Yojana

Why in News?

Recently, the **Jharkhand** Chief Minister announced that the government would soon organize **village-level camps to enroll women in a financial assistance scheme**, which provides **Rs. 1,000 per month.**

Key Points

The announcement was made while inaugurating and laying the foundation stone of various development schemes worth Rs. 88 crore at Rajmahal in Sahibganj district.

- The 'Aapki Sarkar-Aapke Dwar' programme is going to be launched again soon in which the state government will give Rs. 1,000 to eligible women above 21 years and below 50 years of age from families living below the poverty line.
 - About **40 lakh women will come under the purview of this scheme** and they will get the benefits of the scheme.
 - The scheme is renamed as Mukhyamantri Behan-Beti Swavalamban Protsahan Yojana.

Jharkhand Offers Aid to Flood-Hit Assam

Why in News?

According to the Chief Minister of Assam, Jharkhand has offered Rs 2 crore as aid to the flood-affected people of this northeastern state.

Key Points

At least 113 people have been killed in the <u>flood</u>, <u>landslides</u>, lightning and storms due to <u>Assam floods</u>.

Floods

- > About:
 - Floods are the most frequent type of natural disaster and occur when an overflow of water submerges land that is usually dry.
 - Between 1998-2017, 2 Billion people have been affected worldwide due to floods.

Causes:

- These are often caused by heavy rainfall, rapid snowmelt or a storm surge from a tropical cyclone or tsunami in coastal areas.
- > Types of Floods:
 - Flash Floods: These are caused by rapid and excessive rainfall that raises water heights quickly, and rivers, streams, channels or roads may be overtaken.
 - River Floods: These are caused when consistent rain or snow melt forces a river to exceed capacity.
 - **Coastal Floods:** These are caused by **storm surges** associated with tropical cyclones and tsunami.

Jharkhand Workers Stranded in Cameroon

Why in News?

Twenty-seven workers from Jharkhand, currently stranded in Cameroon, have urgently appealed to the Indian government for assistance in evacuating them from the Central African country.

Key Points

- > According to the sources, the **workers were brought to** Cameroon on 31 March, 2024 by a private company.
 - However, the workers have not received wages for the past four months from the company. They reported facing severe shortages of food and water and are unable to afford basic necessities.
- The Ministry of External Affairs is requested to assist ≻ in ensuring safe return of the 27 stranded workers.



- It is located at the junction of western and central \triangleright Africa.
- It is the 24th largest country in Africa and 54th \triangleright largest in the world.
- The capital is Yaoundé, located in the south-central part of the country.
- Bordering countries:
 - o It is bordered by Nigeria and Chad to the northeast, the Central African Republic to the east, the Republic of the Congo to the southeast, Gabon and Equatorial Guinea to the south, and the Atlantic Ocean to the southwest.

- **Relief:** \triangleright
 - o Cameroon's diverse geography comprises northern savanna, central highlands, southern coastal plains, and western volcanic mountains, including Mount Cameroon.

New Chief Justice of Jharkhand High Court

Why in News?

Recently, Justice Bidyut Ranjan Sarangi took oath as the 15th Chief Justice of the Jharkhand High Court.

Key Points

- **Governor C.P. Radhakrishnan administered the oath** of office at the Raj Bhavan in Ranchi.
- \geq Chief Minister Hemant Soren and Speaker Rabindra Nath Mahato attended the swearing-in ceremony, besides several judges and senior government officials.

Appointment of High Court Judges

- > Article 217 of the Constitution states that the Judge of a High Court shall be appointed by the President in consultation with the Chief Justice of India (CJI) and the Governor of the State.
- In the case of appointment of a Judge other than \geqslant the Chief Justice, the Chief Justice of the High Court is consulted.

Hemant Soren to Return as Chief Minister of Jharkhand

Why in News?

Jharkhand Chief minister Champai Soren is likely to resign to pave the way for Hemant Soren's return as Jharkhand's CM after he was released on bail.

Key Points

- > Formalities for the new government formation would begin accordingly and an unanimous decision in this regard was taken at the legislature party meeting of the ruling Jharkhand Mukti Morcha (JMM)-led alliance.
- Champai Soren assumed the role of chief minister after \geq the Enforcement Directorate (ED) arrested Hemant



Note:

Soren over <u>money laundering</u> charges related to an alleged land scam.

Directorate of Enforcement (ED)

- The Directorate of Enforcement (ED) is a multidisciplinary organization mandated with investigation of offences of money laundering and violations of foreign exchange laws.
- It functions under the Department of Revenue of the Ministry of Finance.
- As a premier financial investigation agency of the Government of India, the Enforcement Directorate functions in strict compliance with the **Constitution** and Laws of India.

Money Laundering

- Money laundering is concealing or disguising the identity of illegally obtained money so that they appear to have originated from legitimate sources. It is frequently a component of other, much more serious, crimes such as drug trafficking, robbery or extortion.
- According to the <u>International Monetary Fund (IMF)</u>, global money laundering is estimated between 2 to 5% of World <u>Gross Domestic Product (GDP)</u>.

169th Anniversary of Santhal Rebellion

Why in News?

Recently, the 169th anniversary of **Santhal Rebellion** was celebrated. The Prime Minister paid tribute to the sacrifices and bravery of the **Santhal tribal community**.

Key Points

- The Santhal uprising, one of the most noted events of revolt against the <u>British Raj</u>, took place in 1855 and 1857.
- This was India's first major peasant uprising fueled by the implementation of the <u>Permanent Land</u> <u>Settlement in 1793</u>.
- It was led by four brothers, Sidho, Kanho, Chand, and Bhairav Murmu, along with sisters Phulo and Jhano and covered the regions of Bihar.

Santhal Tribe

- Santhals are the third largest scheduled tribe community in India after Gonds and Bhils.
- Their greatest concentration is in the states of Bihar, Jharkhand, West Bengal, and Orissa, in the eastern part of the country.
- Language:
 - Their **language is Santhali,** a dialect of Kherwari, a Munda (Austroasiatic) language.
 - Santhali, written in <u>OI-Chiki script</u>, is recognised as one of the scheduled languages in the <u>Eighth</u> <u>Schedule to the Constitution</u>.
- Religion:
 - They are nature worshippers and could be seen paying respect at Jaher (sacred groves) in their villages.

Occupation:

 \triangleright

- Most Santhals are **agriculturists**, depending on their farmlands or forests.
- Seasonal forest collection is one of the important sources of their subsidiary income.
