Why in News?

The Chhattisgarh government announced that the **Centre has approved its proposal to provide 15,000 houses** under the **Pradhan Mantri Gramin Awas Yojana.** These houses will be allocated to surrendered **Naxalites** and individuals affected by Naxal violence as part of the welfare initiative.


- Massive displacement of tribal population;

- Lack of effective governance; Insufficient technical intelligence against Naxalism

- Red Corridor: Experiences severe Naxalism-Maoist insurgency
- Schhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Odisha, Bihar, West Bengal, Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh and Kerala

State PCS CA Consolidation DECEMBER 2024

> It is emphasized that the scheme aims to include families excluded from the Socio-Economic Caste Census 2011 and Awas Plus 2018 lists.

Key Points

- Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana-Gramin (PMAY-G) • About:
 - Launched in 2016, the PMAY-G aims to provide housing for the poorest segments of society.
 - The selection of beneficiaries involves a thorough three-stage validation process, including the Socio-Economic Caste Census 2011, Gram Sabha approvals, and geo-tagging, ensuring that aid reaches the most deserving individuals.
- **Under PMAY-G Beneficiaries Receive:**
 - o Financial Assistance: Rs 1.20 lakh in plain areas and Rs 1.30 lakh in hilly states, including northeastern states and union territories.
 - o Additional Support for Toilets: Rs 12,000 for constructing toilets through convergence with schemes like Swachh Bharat Mission - Gramin (SBM-G) or Mahatma Gandhi National Rural **Employment Guarantee Scheme (MGNREGS) or** any other dedicated source of funding.
 - o Employment Support: Mandatory provision of 90/95 person-days of unskilled wage employment for beneficiaries through Mahatma Gandhi National **Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA)** for house construction.
 - Basic Amenities: Access to water, Liquefied petroleum gas (LPG), and electricity connections through convergence with relevant schemes.

Naxalism

- It originated as rebellion against local landlords who bashed a peasant over a land dispute.
 - o The rebellion was initiated in 1967, with an objective of rightful redistribution of the land to working peasants under the leadership of Kanu Sanyal and Jagan Santhal.
- Started in West Bengal, the movement has spread across Eastern India; in less developed areas of states such as Chhattisgarh, Odisha and Andhra Pradesh.
- It is considered that Naxals support Maoist political sentiments and ideology.

- Maoism is a form of communism developed by Mao Tse Tung.
- It is a **doctrine to capture State power** through a combination of armed insurgency, mass mobilization and strategic alliances.

Maoists Encounter in Chhattisgarh

Why in News?

Recently, Seven Maoists were killed in a gun battle with security forces in Abujhmad forests along the Dantewada-Narayanpur border in Chhattisgarh.

Key Points

- > Major Anti-Maoist Operation:
 - Forces Involved: The operation was executed by the District Reserve Guard (DRG) from Kondagaon, Bastar, Narayanpur, and Dantewada, along with the State's Special Task Force (STF) and the Central **Reserve Police Force (CRPF).**
 - Focus Area: The operation targeted Abujhmad, a dense forested region covering Bijapur, Dantewada, and Narayanpur districts, known for Maoist activity.
 - In October 2024, Abujhmad witnessed the largest-ever encounter in Chhattisgarh's history, resulting in the deaths of 38 Maoists.
 - Recovered Items: A large cache of weapons and daily-use items was seized, while no casualties were reported among the security forces.
 - Yearly Progress: Police records show that since 13th December 2023, 217 Maoists have been killed in Bastar, nearly half in Abujhmad under the Maad Bachao Aandolan (Save Maad Campaign).

District Reserve Guard (DRG)

- The District Reserve Guard (DRG) is a specialized police unit in Chhattisgarh, established in 2008 to combat Maoist violence.
- ⊳ It consists of specially trained personnel operating in affected districts, conducting anti-Maoist operations, search and seizure, and gathering intelligence.
- ≻ The DRG collaborates with other security forces, like the Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF), to counter the Maoist insurgency.

Chhattisgarh Tops in Forest and Tree Cover Growth: ISFR

Why in News?

Recently, Chhattisgarh has emerged as the top state in combined forest and tree cover growth according to the Indian Forest Survey Report (ISFR) 2023.

Key Points

- > Chhattisgarh's Forest and Tree Cover Growth:
- Chhattisgarh has emerged as the top state in combined forest and tree cover growth according to the Indian Forest Survey Report (ISFR) 2023.
- Chhattisgarh saw an increase of **94.75 sq km** in forest cover, bringing its total forest area to **55,811.75 sq km**. ≻
- The state recorded a total increase of **684 sq km** in **forest and tree cover**, the highest among all Indian states. \geq
- \triangleright Chhattisgarh's combined forest and tree cover (55,812 sq km) is the third-largest in the country after Madhya Pradesh and Arunachal Pradesh, with a significant increase in both forest and tree areas.

Key Findings from ISFR 2023

Total Forest and Tree Cover: \triangleright

- o India's total forest and tree cover stands at 8,27,357 sq km, which is 25.17% of the country's geographical area.
- The total forest and tree cover in India includes 7,15,343 sq km of forest cover (21.76% of the total geographical area) and **1,12,014 sq km** of **tree cover** (3.41% of the total geographical area).

Top States in Forest and Tree Cover Growth:

- Chhattisgarh: Increased forest and tree cover by 684 sq km.
- o Uttar Pradesh: Increased cover by 559 sq km.
- Odisha: Increased cover by 559 sq km.
- Rajasthan: Increased cover by 394 sq km.
- States with Largest Forest and Tree Cover:
 - Madhya Pradesh: Largest total cover at 85,724 sq km.
 - Arunachal Pradesh: Second-largest cover at 67,083 sq km.
 - Maharashtra: Third-largest cover at 65,383 sq km.
- States with Largest Forest Cover:
 - Madhya Pradesh: 77,073 sq km.
 - Arunachal Pradesh: 65,882 sq km.
 - Chhattisgarh: 55,812 sq km.

Chhattisgarh Railway Station Renovated

Why in News?

Recently, the 136-year-old historic Bhilai railway station underwent renovation under the Amrit Bharat Station Yojna launched by the centre to modernise railway stations.

Key Points

- Historic Bhilai Railway Station Renovated:
 - The 136-year-old Bhilai railway station in Durg district, built in 1888, has been renovated to enhance passenger experience.

- The station now features **cleanliness improvements**, an **air-conditioned (AC) waiting hall**, and **covered sheds** at new platforms to protect passengers from rain and sun.
- Additional amenities include raised ceilings for a spacious feel, improved lighting, and <u>e-ATM machines</u> for ticket purchases and train information.
- o Entrances have been revamped, ensuring easier access, enhanced aesthetics, and better facilities for passengers.

Amrit Bharat Stations Scheme

> About:

- $\sigma~$ The Amrit Bharat Station Scheme aims to redevelop 1309 stations nationwide.
- The redevelopment will provide **modern passenger amenities** along with ensuring well-designed traffic circulation, inter-modal integration, and signage for the guidance of passengers.
- The Scheme was launched in February 2023 by the Ministry of Railways.

Station-wise Plans:

- The station buildings' designs will be inspired by local culture, heritage, and architecture.
 - For instance, the Jaipur Railway Station will feature elements resembling the <u>Hawa Mahal</u> and <u>Amer Fort</u> from Rajasthan.
- > Integrated Approach to Urban Development:
 - The redevelopment is planned with a **holistic approach to urban development**, treating the stations as **"City Centres."**
 - This approach aims to integrate **both sides of the city and create well-designed traffic circulation,** inter-modal connectivity, and clear signage for passengers' guidance.
