Study to Revive Bison Population

Why in News?

Recently, the **Jharkhand** Forest Department launched a **study to revive the declining population of** <u>Bison</u>, commonly known as Gaur, at <u>Palamu Tiger Reserve</u> (PTR).

Key Points

- Bison Population Status in Jharkhand:
 - Bison, an important food source for big cats, has gone extinct across Jharkhand, except in the Palamu Tiger Reserve (PTR).
 - The current bison population in PTR is between
 50 and 70, a significant decline from the 1970s, when it stood at around 150.

Reasons for Decline:

- Major factors include <u>poaching</u>, infections, and habitat disturbances caused by local cattle.
- Domestic cattle, numbering over 1.5 lakh, occupy the bison's habitat, consuming their food and spreading infections like mouth and foot disease.

> Current Conservation Efforts:

- The PTR authority has initiated a study to assess factors affecting bison survival, including habitat improvement and grass species preferences.
 - A comprehensive revival plan will be created after the study.
- To curb the spread of diseases, a vaccination drive is underway to vaccinate 1.5 lakh domestic cattle from 190 surrounding villages.
- Grassland improvement and anti-poaching measures are also being strengthened.

> Core and Buffer Zone Management:

- PTR spans 1,129.93 sq km, with 414.08 sq km designated as core (critical <u>tiger</u> habitat) and 715.85 sq km as a buffer zone.
- Betla National Park occupies 226.32 sq km of PTR, with 53 sq km in the buffer zone open to tourists.
- Efforts are underway to relocate eight of the 34 villages within PTR limits to protect core habitats.

The Bison

About:

- The Indian Bison or Gaur (Bos gaurus) is the tallest species of wild cattle found in India and largest extant bovine.
- There are about 13,000 to 30,000 gaurs in the world with approximately 85% of the population present in India.
 - The <u>first-ever population estimation exercise</u>
 of the Indian gaur carried out in <u>the Nilgiris</u>
 <u>Forest Division</u> in February 2020 estimated around 2,000 Indian gaurs to be inhabiting the division.



> Geography:

- It is native to South and Southeast Asia.
- In India, they are very much prevalent in the Western Ghats.
 - They are primarily found in <u>Nagarhole National</u>
 <u>Park</u>, <u>Bandipur National Park</u>, Masinagudi

 National Park and Biligirirangana Hills (BR Hills).
- o It is also found in **Burma and Thailand.**

> Habitat:

- They prefer evergreen forests and moist deciduous forests.
- They are **not found in the Himalayas** with an altitude greater than 6,000 ft.

Conservation Status:

- O Vulnerable in **IUCN Red List.**
- Included in the Schedule I of the Wild Life Protection Act, 1972.

'5G Use Case Test Lab' Inaugurated in Ranchi

Why in News?

Recently, the Union Minister for Coal and Mines inaugurated the <u>'5G Use Case Test Lab'</u> at the <u>Central Mine Planning and Design Institute (CMPDI)</u> in Ranchi, Jharkhand.

The facility aims to advance the coal sector's digital transformation and technological capabilities.

Key Points

> Sustainable Art Showcase:

- The minister unveiled a 'Replica of CMPDI services' sculpture made from industrial scrap material, showcasing CMPDI's services in geomatics, exploration, and environmental monitoring.
- The installation emphasizes recycling and sustainable practices in art.
- The Minister also launched CMPDI's new corporate logo.

> 5G Use Case Lab:

- o Features:
 - The lab serves as a scaled-down representation of an <u>Industry 5G Private Network</u>, tailored for the coal sector.

Capabilities:

- Integrates 5G Radio, Core technologies, Edge/ Cloud IT/OT applications, and 5G-enabled devices.
- Supports voice, video, and data communication applications.
- Includes IIoT sensors for vehicle management and other applications.

Objectives:

- Develop 5G use cases such as predictive maintenance, smart mining, and real-time monitoring.
- Create a replicable model of a 5G private network for real-world applications.

Future Applications:

 Implement advanced technologies like digital twins, Automated Guided Vehicles (AGVs), and AR/VR for operational optimization.

> Benefits to the Coal Industry:

- Reliable, high-speed, low-latency connectivity to support mission-critical operations.
- Real-time data exchange for better decision-making and streamlined processes.
- The private captive network ensures data generated during operations remains with <u>Coal India Limited</u> (CIL).
- Adoption of 5G will improve efficiency and safety in mining operations.

Coal India Limited

> About:

- CIL is a state-owned coal mining corporation in India, responsible for producing and managing coal resources in the country.
 - It was founded in 1975 and is the world's largest coal producer.

> Organisational Structure:

- CIL is classified as a <u>'Maharatna'</u> public sector enterprise and operates through 8 subsidiaries like Eastern Coalfields Limited (ECL), Bharat Coking Coal Limited (BCCL).
- Mahanadi Coalfields Limited (MCL) is CIL's largest coal-producing subsidiary.

> Strategic Importance:

- Over half of India's installed power capacity is coal-based, with CIL supplying around 78% of the country's total coal production.
- Coal also accounts for 40% of India's primary commercial energy needs.
- Mining Capacity:
 - Across eight Indian states, CIL operates in 84 mining areas, and manages a total of 313 active mines.

Panchayat Se Parliament 2.0

Why in News?

Recently, Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla inaugurated <u>"Panchayat Se Parliament 2.0"</u> aiming to provide women representatives from Panchayati Raj institutions across the country with insights into <u>the Constitution</u> and parliamentary procedures.

The event commemorates the 150th birth anniversary of tribal icon Birsa Munda.

Key Points

- > Aim:
 - The initiative aims to empower these elected women representatives from <u>Panchayati Raj institutions</u> by enhancing their knowledge of constitutional provisions, parliamentary procedures, and governance, fostering effective leadership.
 - The programme brings together 502 elected women representatives from <u>Scheduled Tribes</u> across 22 States and Union Territories, ensuring inclusivity and diversity.
- Workshops and Sessions:
 - The programme includes interactive workshops and sessions moderated by experts and <u>Members</u> of <u>Parliament</u>.
 - It is organised by <u>National Commission for Women</u> (<u>NCW</u>) and <u>Lok Sabha Secretariat</u>, in collaboration with the Ministry of Tribal Affairs.
- Guided Tours:
 - Participants embarked on guided tours of the New Parliament House, Samvidhan Sadan, Pradhanmantri Sangrahalaya, and Rashtrapati Bhavan to gain a deeper understanding of India's legislative processes and democratic institutions.

Birsa Munda

He was born on 15th November 1875. He belonged to the Munda tribe.



- He spearheaded an Indian tribal religious Millenarian movement during British rule in the late 19th century across the tribal belt of modern-day Jharkhand and Bihar.
- He led <u>the Munda Rebellion (Ulgulan)</u>, and his birth anniversary is celebrated as <u>Janjatiya Gaurav Divas</u>.

First Instalment of Mainiya Samman Yojana

Why in News?

During an event in Ranchi, Jharkhand Chief Minister transferred Rs 11,415.44 crore to 56.62 lakh women under the 'Mukhyamantri Mainiya Samman Yojana,' with each receiving Rs 2,500 through direct benefit transfer (DBT).

Key Points

- Empowering Women Beneficiaries:
 - Addressing a gathering of women from all 24 districts, the CM emphasized empowering women to achieve their dreams independently.
 - The scheme's potential to enable women to provide better education, health facilities, and meet their day-to-day needs was highlighted.
 - He encouraged women to use the funds to buy nutritious food, including meat and fish, to combat anemia.
 - The money could also help women purchase gas cylinders, clothing for festivals, and school supplies for children, reducing reliance on government food grains.

Mukhyamantri Mainiya Samman Yojana

- Launched in August 2024, it provides Rs 1,000 monthly to women aged 21-50 through Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT).
- Ahead of Assembly polls, the financial assistance was increased to Rs 2,500 due to its popularity.
