

Samarth Scheme for Textile Sector

Why in News

The **Ministry of Textiles** is implementing the Samarth-Scheme for Capacity Building in the Textiles Sector.

Samarth Scheme, also known as Scheme for Capacity Building in the Textile Sector
(SCBTS), was approved by <u>Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs (CCEA)</u> in 2017 in order
to ensure steady supply of skilled manpower in the labour-intensive textile sector.

Key Points

- Objectives:
 - Provide demand driven, placement oriented <u>National Skills Qualifications Framework</u>
 (NSQF) compliant skilling programmes to create jobs in the organized textile and related sectors, covering the entire value chain of textile, excluding Spinning and Weaving.
 - Promote **skilling and skill upgradation** in the traditional sectors of handlooms, handicrafts, sericulture and jute.
 - Enable provision of sustainable livelihood either by wage or self employment.
- 18 State Governments have been allocated a training target of 3.6 lakh beneficiaries for conducting **training programmes in traditional and organized sectors.**
- Industry/industry associations are being empanelled for undertaking industry oriented entry level skilling programmes in the organized sectors.
