

Honours to India's Hansa Mehta

Recently, the President of the <u>United Nations General Assembly (UNGA)</u> honoured <u>Hansa Mehta</u> on the **International Day for Women in Diplomacy (24 June).**

This day honors and acknowledges the contributions and accomplishments of women in therealm of diplomacy.

Hansa Mehta:

- She was a prominent Indian scholar, educator, social reformer, writer and diplomat from India.
- She was born on 3rd July 1897 and was a champion of women's rights.
- Mehta played a pivotal role in revising the <u>Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR)</u> to include **gender-inclusive language.**
 - She successfully changed the phrase, "All men are born free and equal," to "All human beings are born free and equal" in Article 1 of the UDHR.
- As the President of All India Women's Conference (AIWC) in 1946, she led the drafting of the "Indian Women's Charter of Rights", which demanded gender equality, civil rights and justice for women in India.
- She was also part of the <u>Constituent Assembly</u> of India, a member of its **Advisory Committee** and sub-Committee on Fundamental Rights.
- She was the only other female delegate, apart from Eleanor Roosevelt to the <u>United Nations</u> <u>Commission on Human Rights.</u>
