

Poor Infrastructure of Government Schools in Madhya Pradesh

Why in News?

Madhya Pradesh is the **first state in the country to have implemented the** <u>National Education Policy</u> (<u>NEP</u>) 2020. However, there is poor infrastructure and the absence of teachers in the classrooms.

Key Points

- The NEP 2020 seeks to tackle the evolving development needs of India.
 - It calls for a comprehensive overhaul of the education system, including its regulations and management, to establish a modern system that aligns with 21st-century educational goals, including <u>Sustainable Development Goal 4 (SDG 4)</u>, while respecting India's cultural heritage and values.
 - It replaces the thirty-four year old National Policy on Education, 1986, modified in 1992 (NPE 1986/92).
- The high school results in Madhya Pradesh have been consistently poor for six years, with a significant number of students failing in Mathematics and English in 2023.
- While a lot has been done to improve the schools on the supply side with <u>Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan</u> and subsequent efforts, there is a need for rejuvenating and re-imagining learning in schools.
 - Samagra Shiksha subsumes the three Schemes of Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA), Rashtriya Madhyamik Shiksha Abhiyan (RMSA) and Teacher Education (TE).

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
