

## **Delhi-Haryana Water Crisis**

## Why in News?

Recently, the Delhi Water Minister visited the **Wazirabad barrage** and appealed to the Haryana government to **release water** in the <u>Yamuna river</u>.

## **Key Points**

- The Wazirabad barrage gets water from Haryana which goes to the water treatment plants of Chandrawal. Okhla and Wazirabad.
- The water dispute between Haryana and Delhi highlights the challenges of resource allocation and management in the region.

## Yamuna River

- About:
  - The Yamuna River is one of the major tributaries of the Ganges in Northern India.
  - It forms an integral part of the <u>Yamuna-Ganga Plain</u>, one of the world's most extensive alluvial plains.
- Source:
  - It has its source in the <u>Yamunotri Glacier</u> at an elevation of 6,387 meters on the southwestern sides of Banderpooch crests in the <u>lower Himalayan ranges</u>.
- Basin:
  - It meets the Ganges at the Sangam (where Kumbh mela is held) in Prayagraj, Uttar
    Pradesh after flowing through Uttarakhand, Himachal Pradesh, Haryana and Delhi.
- Important Dam: Lakhwar-Vyasi Dam (Uttarakhand), Tajewala Barrage Dam (Haryana) etc.
- Important Tributaries: Chambal, Sindh, Betwa and Ken.
- Government Initiatives Related to Yamuna River:
  - Yamuna Action Plan
  - Delhi Government's Six-Point Action Plan to Clean Yamuna by February 2025.
