National Zoological Park, New Delhi, recently observed the <u>International Day of Forests</u> on **21st March 2024**, under the theme "**Forests and innovation: new solutions for a better world.**"

- The event aimed to raise awareness among visitors about the importance of forests and their role in our lives.
- The <u>United Nations General Assembly</u> proclaimed 21st March the International Day of Forests in 2012 to celebrate and raise awareness of the importance of all types of forests.
 - Countries are urged to conduct local, national, and international activities related to forests and trees, like tree planting campaigns.
- The United Nations Forum on Forests, the <u>Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO)</u>, and other relevant organisations collaborate with governments to organise these efforts.
- As per the latest <u>India State of Forest Report (ISFR) 2021</u>, <u>India's total forest and tree cover was</u>
 80.9 million hectares, which accounted for 24.62% of the geographical area of the country.
 - Madhya Pradesh had the largest forest cover, followed by Arunachal Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Odisha and Maharashtra.
- India's <u>National Forest Policy</u>, <u>1988</u> aims for at least 33% of the total geographical area to be under forest to maintain ecological stability.

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
