The centralised <u>Civil Registration System (CRS) portal</u>, responsible for registering births and deaths across India, has been facing significant technical issues, leading to widespread disruptions in the issuance of certificates.

- According to the <u>2023 Registration of Births and Deaths (Amendment) Act</u>, all births and deaths in India from 1st October 2023 will be digitally registered through the CRS portal.
 - The digital birth certificates will serve as proof of date of birth for various services.
 - The centralised database will update the <u>National Population Register (NPR)</u>, <u>ration</u>
 <u>cards</u>, property registration and <u>electoral rolls</u>.
 - The NPR, collected in 2010 and updated in 2015, has a database of 119 crore residents.
 - So far, 23 States and six union territories have migrated to the new portal. States such
 as Tamil Nadu which have their own portals send the data compulsorily to the Centre
 in a real-time basis as mandated by the 2023 amendment.
- States have flagged issues in the CRS portal, such as slow performance, frequent error messages, and data syncing problems. These issues have caused delays in issuing certificates.
