

## All India Conference of Director Generals of Police

## Why in News?

Recently, the Prime Minister of India attended the **58<sup>th</sup> All India Conference of Director Generals**/Inspector Generals of Police in **Jaipur, Rajasthan.** 

## **Key Points**

- It was a three-day being held in hybrid mode with DGPs (Director general of police), IGPs (Inspector-General of Police) and Chiefs of Central Police Organisations.
- A wide range of policing and internal security issues including Cyber Crime, Technology in Policing, Counter Terrorism challenges, Left Wing Extremism, and Prison Reforms were discussed at the conference.
- Another key agenda of the conference is deliberations on the road map for implementation of the new Criminal Laws.
- The Intelligence Bureau organized the first-ever Conference of the IGPs in India in 1920 and since then, these conferences have been held regularly in New Delhi.
  - The first such conference held post-independence was inaugurated by the first Home Minister of the country, <u>Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel</u>, on January 12, 1950.
  - Initially, it was a biennial event, but after 1973, it became an annual meeting for the heads of police organizations of the states and union territories, as well as central police organizations.
