Main Examination Syllabus

Qualifying Paper- English

The aim of the paper is to test the candidate's ability to read and understand serious discursive prose, and to express his ideas clearly and correctly.

The pattern of questions would be broadly as follows:

- Comprehension of given passages.
- Precis Writing.
- Usage and Vocabulary.
- Short Essays.
- Minimum Qualification Standard- 25% / 75 Marks

(The paper will be of Matriculation or equivalent standard and will be of qualifying nature only. The marks obtained in this paper will not be counted for final ranking.)

Paper-I (Essay)

Candidates may be required to write essays on multiple topics. They will be expected to keep closely to the subject of the essay to arrange their ideas in orderly fashion, and to write concisely. Credit will be given for effective and exact expression.

- Role of Women and Women's Organization, Population and Associated Issues, Poverty and Developmental issues, Urbanization, their problems and their remedies. Effects of Globalization on Indian society.
