



The state government has approved the establishment of 15 new Government Colleges

Why in News?

According to the information received from the Higher Education Department of Chhattisgarh on June 20, 2023, the state government has approved the establishment of 15 new government colleges in the state under the provisions made under the main head 2023-24.

Key Points:

- According to the information, implementing the announcement made in the budget speech of Chhattisgarh Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel in the Vidhan Sabha, approval has been given by the state government for the establishment of colleges in remote areas of Chhattisgarh and other places.
- Along with this, permission has been given to start classes along with approval for the creation of 495 posts at the rate of 33 posts per approved college.
