

Jharkhand Workers Stranded in Cameroon

Why in News?

Twenty-seven workers from Jharkhand, currently **stranded in** <u>Cameroon</u>, have urgently appealed to the Indian government for assistance in evacuating them from the Central African country.

Key Points

- According to the sources, the workers were brought to Cameroon on 31 March, 2024 by a private company.
 - However, the workers have not received wages for the past four months from the company. They reported facing severe shortages of food and water and are unable to afford basic necessities.
- <u>The Ministry of External Affairs</u> is **requested to assist** in ensuring safe return of the 27 stranded workers.

Cameroon



- It is located at the junction of western and central Africa.
- It is the 24th largest country in Africa and 54th largest in the world.
- The **capital is Yaoundé**, located in the south-central part of the country.
- Bordering countries:
 - It is bordered by Nigeria and Chad to the northeast, the Central African Republic to

the east, the **Republic of the Congo** to the southeast, **Gabon and Equatorial Guinea** to the south, and the <u>Atlantic Ocean</u> to the southwest.

Relief:

 Cameroon's diverse geography comprises northern savanna, central highlands, southern coastal plains, and western volcanic mountains, including Mount Cameroon.
