


India to Develop Six Mega Ports by 2047

In a recent update by the **Ministry of Ports, Shipping and Waterways**, significant plans have been outlined for the **development of Mega Ports in India by 2047.**

- Six port clusters identified for development as Mega Ports by 2047.
 - Four port clusters with a capacity exceeding 300 Million Tonnes Per Annum (MTPA):
 - Cochin -<u>Vizhinjam Port</u> cluster, <u>Galathea</u> South Bay Port, Chennai Kamarajar-Cuddalore Port cluster, Paradip and Other Non-Major Ports <u>Cluster</u>.
 - Two port clusters with Capacity Exceeding 500 MTPA:
 - (i) Deendayal and Tuna Tekra and (ii) Jawaharlal Nehru Vadhavan.
- Major Ports are enhancing capacity and infrastructure as part of the Maritime AmritKaal Vision,
 2047.
 - Infrastructure projects are underway via <u>Public-Private Partnership (PPP)</u> and internal resources, focusing on port development.
