Why in News?

Recently, [President](#) of India Droupadi Murmu undertook a two-day official visit to Chhattisgarh, focusing on educational and cultural engagements.

Key Points

- **Events in Raipur:**
 - President Murmu attended the **10th convocation ceremony of AIIMS Raipur**, where she addressed students and staff.
- **Cultural Honors:**
 - In her itinerary, she paid respects at Mahamaya Temple and participated in events highlighting the **state's rich tribal heritage**.
- **Focus on Health & Education:**
 - Her discussions emphasized the advancement of **healthcare education and infrastructure in Chhattisgarh**.

President of India

 - All the executive business of the country are carried out in the name of the president.
 - Article 52 of the COI states that there shall be a president.

Elephant Deaths in Bandhavgarh Tiger Reserve | Madhya Pradesh | 04 Nov 2024

Why in News?

Recently, four elephants were found dead and five others critically ill in [Bandhavgarh Tiger Reserve, Madhya Pradesh](#), prompting a thorough investigation by wildlife officials and conservation teams.

Key Points

▪ **Bandhavgarh Tiger Reserve:**

- Located in Madhya Pradesh, [Bandhavgarh Tiger Reserve](#) spans an area rich in biodiversity and serves as one of India's premier tiger habitats.

◦ **Elephant Population:**


- Originally devoid of elephants, the reserve saw its first elephant herd migration from Chhattisgarh in 2018, marking the start of a permanent elephant population within the reserve.
- The initial herd numbered around 15-20 elephants and has since been observed in both core and buffer areas of the reserve.

- The elephants were located in **Reserved Forest (RF) 384 and Protected Forest (PF) 183 A**, in the Salakhaniya Beat of Khitauli and Pataur core ranges.

Bandhavgarh Tiger Reserve (BTR)

- It is located in the **Umariya district of Madhya Pradesh** and is spread over the Vindhya hills.
- **In 1968**, it was notified as a national park and in 1993 was declared a tiger reserve- under the Project Tiger Network at the neighbouring Panpatha Sanctuary.
- It is known for the **Royal Bengal Tigers**. The density of the tiger population at Bandhavgarh is the highest known in India as well as in the world.
 - These streams then merge into the [Son river](#) (an important southern tributary to the river Ganga).
- The important prey species consists of **chital, sambhar, barking deer, nilgai, chinkara, wild pig, chowsingha, langur and rhesus macaque**.
 - Dependent upon them are the major predators like tiger, [leopard](#), wild dog, wolf and jackal.

- **Top 5 Indian States by Maximum Elephant Population:** (As per elephant census 2017)
 - Karnataka > Assam > Kerala > Tamil Nadu > Odisha
- **Social Structure:**
 - Female elephants are more social than males; form herd (generally 5-7)
 - Led by the oldest female, the 'matriarch'
 - Males usually live alone

- **Threats:**
 - Habitat Fragmentation
 - Poaching for Ivory
 - Human-Elephant Conflict
 - Mistreatment in Captivity

Uttar Pradesh Expands Sanskrit Scholarship Scheme | Uttar Pradesh | 04 Nov 2024

Why in News?

Recently, the Uttar Pradesh government launched a new scholarship scheme to support [Sanskrit education](#), enhancing eligibility and funding for students.

Key Points

- **Expansion:**
 - The scheme now supports **69,195 students with a budget of Rs. 586 lakh**, a significant increase from the previous 300 beneficiaries.
 - Unlike the prior scheme, which had strict age limits, the new scholarship is open to all qualified Sanskrit students across Uttar Pradesh.
 - CM emphasized **Sanskrit's relevance** to scientific fields such as computer science, encouraging students to view it as a language with broad applications.
- **Support for Traditional Gurukul Education:**
 - Plans to revive [gurukul-style schools](#) were announced, with improved support for residential facilities and hiring of qualified teachers.
 - Establishment of a Vedic science center will facilitate research, integrating traditional Sanskrit knowledge with modern scientific inquiry.

Gurukul

- The 'Gurukul' was a type of education system in ancient India with shishya (students) living with the guru in the same house.
- Nalanda has the oldest university system of education in the world.
- Students from across the world were attracted to Indian knowledge systems.

Preparations for Kumbh Mela 2025 | Uttar Pradesh | 04 Nov 2024

Why in News?

Recently, UP CM announced measures to make the [Kumbh Mela](#) 2025 a safer, culturally rich event.

Key Points

- **Enhanced Safety Measures:**
 - Advanced security and surveillance systems, including [drones](#), will be deployed for crowd control and emergency response.
- **Cultural Showcases:**
 - Traditional performances and exhibitions will feature throughout the Mela, emphasizing India's diverse heritage.
- **Infrastructural Developments:**

- Road expansion, improved sanitation, and upgraded facilities are prioritized to handle millions of pilgrims.
- **Environment-Friendly Initiatives:**
 - Steps to minimize waste and maintain the cleanliness of the Ganga River and surrounding areas.

Kumbh Mela

- Kumbh Mela is the largest peaceful congregation of pilgrims during which participants bathe or take a dip in a sacred river.
- Kumbh Mela comes under the [UNESCO's Representative List of Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity](#).
- The festival is held at **Prayagraj (at the confluence of Ganga, Yamuna, and the mythical Saraswati), Haridwar (on the Ganges), Ujjain (on the Shipra) and Nasik (on the Godavari) every four years** by rotation and is attended by millions of people irrespective of caste, creed or gender.
- As it is held in four different cities in India, it involves different social and cultural activities, making this a culturally diverse festival.
- The event encapsulates the science of astronomy, astrology, spirituality, ritualistic traditions, and social and cultural customs and practices, making it extremely rich in knowledge.
- Knowledge and skills related to the tradition are transmitted through ancient religious manuscripts, oral traditions, historical travelogues and texts produced by eminent historians.
- The teacher-student relationship of the sadhus in the ashrams and akhadas remains the most important method of imparting and safeguarding knowledge and skills relating to Kumbh Mela.

Why in News?

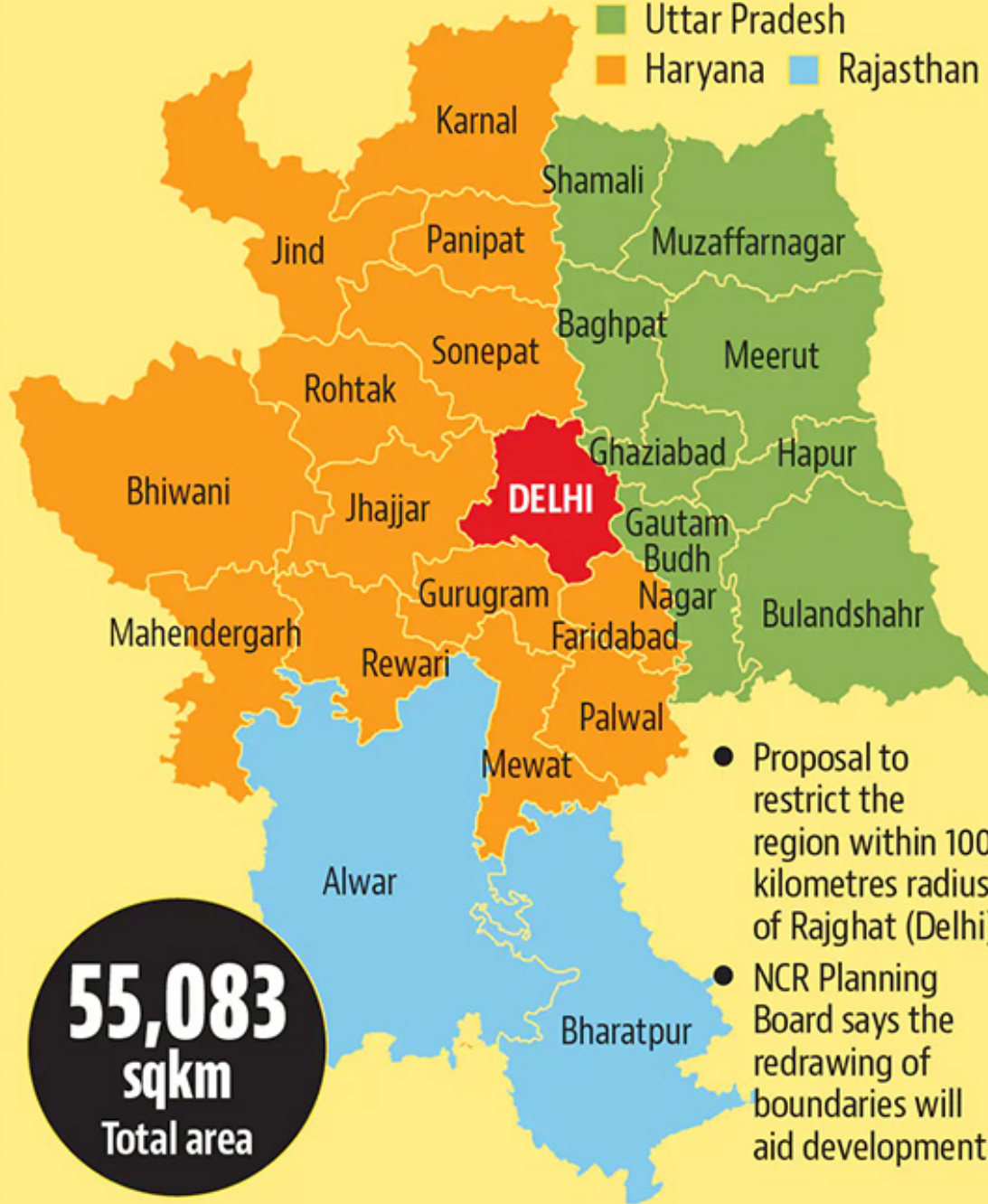
- Recently, worsening air quality in the **NCR (National Capital Region)** region has driven residents to Uttarakhand for cleaner air and a healthier Diwali celebration.

Key Points

- **Surge in Tourist Bookings:**
 - NCR residents are increasingly booking hotels and homestays in Uttarakhand, especially in areas like Dehradun, Nainital, and Mussoorie, to escape pollution.
 - Uttarakhand's relatively low pollution levels during Diwali make it an appealing refuge amid NCR's smoggy skies.
 - Families, especially with elderly and children, prioritize escaping the health risks associated with high pollution levels in urban areas.
 - The influx benefits Uttarakhand's tourism economy, with higher demands for accommodations and local services.

Uttarakhand's Diwali Gift | Uttarakhand | 04 Nov 2024

Why in News?

Recently, Uttarakhand announced a festive increase in [Dearness Allowance \(DA\)](#) for state government employees as a Diwali benefit.

Key Points

▪ DA Hike:

- Uttarakhand raised the DA for government employees by a set percentage, aiming to mitigate inflation's impact on household expenses.
- The DA has been increased from **50% to 53% per month**.
- The dearness allowance hike applies to all regular and full-time state employees and [UGC](#)-affiliated officials, retroactive from **1st July, 2024**, with arrears from July to **September 2024** payable in cash.
- The increased DA is effective immediately, covering employees and pensioners under the state government.

▪ Economic Impact:

- This increase supports employees' purchasing power, particularly significant during the festive season when expenses are typically higher.
- Similar DA adjustments are seen across states as they aim to provide financial relief amidst rising living costs.

Dearness Allowance (DA)

- It is the cost-of-living adjustment to offset inflation, provided to government employees and pensioners. It is calculated as a percentage of the basic salary.
