

Prime Minister's National Relief Fund

An <u>acid attack</u> survivor has approached the Delhi High Court seeking **additional compensation** from the <u>Prime Minister's National Relief Fund (PMNRF)</u>, highlighting delays and challenges in accessing the grant.

- PMNRF was instituted in 1948 by then Prime Minister <u>Jawaharlal Nehru</u>, to assist displaced persons from Pakistan. The fund is currently used to provide support to people affected by natural and man-made disasters.
 - This includes natural disasters like <u>floods</u>, <u>cyclones</u>, and <u>earthquakes</u>, and <u>man-made</u> disasters like major accidents, acid attacks, and riots.
- The fund consists entirely of public contributions and does not get any budgetary support.
- The corpus of the fund is invested with banks in <u>fixed deposits</u>. Disbursements are made with the approval of the <u>Prime Minister</u>.
- All donations towards the PMNRF are notified for 100% deduction from taxable income under Section 80G of the Income Tax Act, 1961.
