Why in News?

After announcing plans to develop the <u>'Ram Van Gaman Path'</u>, the Madhya Pradesh government will also develop places in the state associated with Lord Krishna.

 'Ram Van Gaman Path' is the route believed to be taken by Lord Ram when he headed for exile in the forest.

Key Points

- The Chief Minister told officials of the <u>Tourism</u> and <u>Culture Department</u> that necessary arrangements should also be made for <u>pilgrims</u> at the <u>places visited</u> by <u>Lord Krishna</u> in the state.
 - Lord Krishna went to <u>Ujjain</u> in the state from Mathura and stayed at sage Sandipani's Ashram where he learned various arts and studied the Vedas.
 - Narayan Dham at Amjhera in Dhar district and the Mahidpur tehsil of Ujjain district also have special religious significance.
 - Amjhera has many ancient temples of Shaiva and Vaishnava sects and is associated with Lord Krishna and Rukmani.
 - Narayan Dham has the only temple in the world where Lord Krishna is seen with his friend Sudama.
- Better facilities and infrastructure will increase the flow of tourists and devotees to these
 places.
- International Gita and Ramayana Mahotsav (festival) can be held in the near future by involving the common people, and manufacturing of miniature statues of gods and goddesses should be encouraged for helping the local economy.
