

Dr. Ambedkar's Death Anniversary | Uttar Pradesh | 09 Dec 2024

Why in News?

Recently, Uttar Pradesh leaders paid tributes to Dalit icon and **India's first Law Minister Dr. Bhimrao Ramji Ambedkar,** who headed the <u>Drafting Committee</u> of the Indian Constitution, on his death anniversary.





Key Points

About:

- Dr. Bhimrao Ramji Ambedkar was a prominent Indian jurist, economist, social reformer, and politician.
- He was born on April 14, 1891 in Mhow, Madhya Pradesh.
 - His father, Subedar Ramji Maloji Sakpal, was a well-read person and follower of Sant Kabir.

Education:

 Ambedkar earned his Bachelor's degree from Bombay University and went on for further studies to Columbia University in New York and London School of Economics.

Contributions:

- In **1924**, he started an <u>Association for the welfare of the depressed classes</u> **and in 1927**, he started the <u>Bahishkrit Bharat newspaper</u> to address the cause of the depressed classes.
 - He also led the Mahad Satyagraha in March 1927.
- He participated in all three <u>Round Table Conferences</u>.
- In 1932, Dr. Ambedkar signed the <u>Poona pact</u> with <u>Mahatma Gandhi</u>, which abandoned the idea of separate electorates for the depressed classes (<u>Communal Award</u>).
- In 1936, he formed the Independent Labour Party to safeguard the interests of the depressed classes.
- In 1942, Dr. Ambedkar was appointed to the Executive Council of the Governor General
 of India as a Labour member and elected to the Constituent Assembly from Bengal in

1946.

- He was the <u>Chairman of Drafting Committee</u> and remembered as the <u>Father of the Indian Constitution</u>.
- In 1947, Dr. Ambedkar became **Minister of Law in the first Cabinet of independent**
 - He resigned from the cabinet in 1951, over differences on the Hindu Code Bill.
- Additional Details:
 - Later in life, He converted to <u>Buddhism</u>. He passed away on **December 6, 1956, which** is commemorated as <u>Mahaparinirvan Diwas.</u>
 - Chaitya Bhoomi is a memorial to B R Ambedkar, located in Mumbai.
 - He was also awarded India's highest civilian honour the Bharat Ratna in 1990.
