

Kendriya Vidyalayas to be set up in Rajasthan | Rajasthan | 10 Dec 2024

Why in News?

Recently, **the Union Government** has approved the opening of nine new <u>Kendriya Vidyalayas</u> in Rajasthan that will **increase opportunities for quality** <u>education</u> **in the State.**

Key Points

- Approval for New Schools:
 - The Union Cabinet approved the establishment of **85 new Kendriya Vidyalayas and 28** new <u>Navodaya Vidyalayas</u> across the nation.
 - These schools will provide affordable and high-quality education to over 82,000 students.
 - In Rajasthan, the newly approved Kendriya Vidyalayas are in Jodhpur, Ganganagar, Karauli, Nagaur, Rajsamand and Dausa District.
 - The move aims to expand quality education, enhance educational infrastructure, and contribute to the holistic development of the younger generation.
- Broader Implications:
 - The initiative aligns with the government's mission to improve access to quality education nationwide.
 - It supports the growth and empowerment of India's youth, contributing to the nation's overall development trajectory

Rising Rajasthan Global Investment Summit 2024 | Rajasthan | 10 Dec 2024

Why in News?

Recently, the Prime Minister inaugurated the <u>Rising Rajasthan Global Investment Summit, 2024</u> and the <u>Rajasthan Global Business Expo</u> at <u>Jaipur Exhibition and Convention Centre (JECC)</u>.

Key Points

- Global Investment Summit 2024:
 - The Investment Summit **theme** is "**Replete, Responsible, Ready,**" with discussions on <u>sustainable mining</u>, <u>water security</u>, **and women-led** <u>startups.</u>
 - Over 32 countries and 20 international organizations will join thematic sessions and expos showcasing Rajasthan's potential.
- Rajasthan's Development Potential:

- Rajasthan holds significant <u>mineral reserves</u>, vast <u>natural resources</u>, and a rich <u>cultural</u> <u>heritage</u>, positioning it as an **investment destination**.
- Rajasthan benefits from projects like the <u>Delhi-Mumbai Industrial Corridor</u> and <u>Dedicated</u> <u>Freight Corridor</u>, improving industrial logistics.
- With unique attractions like <u>Ranthambore</u> and Jaipur, Rajasthan is a **hub for** <u>wildlife</u>, <u>heritage</u>, **and** <u>adventure tourism</u>.
- Role in Renewable Energy and Manufacturing:
 - Rajasthan contributes to <u>India's renewable energy goals</u> with large <u>solar parks</u> supporting the 500 GW capacity target by 2030.
 - Under <u>Make in India</u> and <u>Production Linked Incentive (PLI) schemes</u>, Rajasthan is building capacity in automotive, <u>Electric Vehicles</u>, and electronics manufacturing.
- Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs):
 - Rajasthan is **among the top 5 states in MSMEs,** with over 27 lakh units employing 50 lakh people.
 - New MSME policies and credit schemes like the <u>Emergency Credit Linked Guarantee</u> <u>Scheme</u> have doubled credit flow to MSMEs since 2014.
 - MSMEs in Rajasthan are playing a pivotal role in enhancing global supply chains.

Emergency Credit Line Guarantee Scheme

- ECLGS was launched in 2020 as part of the Centre's <u>Aatmanirbhar package</u> in response to the <u>Covid-19</u> crisis.
- The objective was to support small businesses struggling to meet their operational liabilities due to the imposition of a nationwide lockdown.
- A 100% guarantee is provided by the National Credit Guarantee Trustee Company (NCGTC) to Member Lending Institutions (MLIs) - banks, financial institutions and <u>Non-Banking</u> <u>Financial Companies (NBFCs).</u>
- The credit product for which guarantee would be provided under the Scheme shall be named as 'Guaranteed Emergency Credit Line (GECL)'

Markhor | Jammu & Kashmir | 10 Dec 2024

Why in News?

Recently, Markhor, a <u>wild goat</u> with spiral-shaped horns, was spotted in Baramulla district of North Kashmir.



Key Points

- About:
 - Markhor is the **largest wild goat** in the world. It is known for its thick fur, flowing beard and corkscrew horns.
- Legal Protection and Species Status:
 - Markhor, scientifically known as **Capra falconeri**, is classified as "**Near Threatened**" by the <u>IUCN</u> and protected under Schedule I of India's <u>Wildlife Protection Act</u>, 1972.
- Threats to Survival:
 - Primary threats include habitat loss from fencing, illegal <u>grazing</u>, <u>poaching</u>, and <u>encroachment</u>. <u>Climate change</u> is also affecting food resources, driving Markhor closer to human settlements.
- Global Recognition and Initiatives:
 - Recognizing its ecological importance, the <u>UN General Assembly</u> designated 24th May as the International Day of the Markhor to encourage conservation efforts.
- Significance as a Flagship Species:
 - Markhor serves as a flagship species for conservation in J&K, helping protect other regional wildlife, such as <u>Musk Deer</u> **and** <u>Brown Bear</u>.
- Distribution and Habitat:
 - The endangered Markhor inhabits moist to semi-arid mountain regions across Pakistan, India (Jammu & Kashmir), Afghanistan, Uzbekistan, Turkmenistan, and Tajikistan.
 - In J&K, it's found in areas like **Shopian, the** <u>Pir Panjal range</u>, **and Kazinag Uri**, but its population is fragmented due to human interference and habitat loss.

Green Cess in Uttarakhand | Uttarakhand | 10 Dec 2024

Why in News?

According to the officials, the **Uttarakhand Government** will soon impose a <u>green cess</u> on out-of-state vehicles.

• A Green cess is a **form of tax** levied by the government with the **purpose of** <u>environmental</u> <u>conservation</u>.

Key Points

- Introduction of Green Cess in Uttarakhand:
 - The cess will range from Rs 20 to Rs 80 and will apply to both commercial and private vehicles.
 - Two-wheelers, <u>electric vehicles</u> and <u>Compressed Natural Gas (CNG)</u> vehicles, ambulances, fire brigades, and vehicles registered in Uttarakhand will be exempted.
- Implementation and Technology:
 - The system is targeted to become **operational by the end of December 2024.**
 - Automatic **number plate recognition cameras** will identify vehicles, and cess amounts will be **deducted directly from** vehicle owners' <u>FASTag</u> wallets.

FASTag

- It is a device that employs <u>Radio Frequency Identification (RFID) technology</u> for making toll
 payments directly while the vehicle is in motion.
- <u>National Highways Authority of India (NHAI)</u> launched two mobile Apps MyFASTag and FASTag Partner to facilitate the availability of FASTags.

• The **tag is valid for 5 years** from the date of issuance and comes in seven different color codes.

Landslide Zones Successfully Treated in Uttarakhand | Uttarakhand | 10 Dec 2024

Why in News?

According to the <u>Border Roads Organisation (BRO)</u>, the **rock bolt technology** is successfully treating **active** <u>landslide zones</u> in the hilly areas of Uttarakhand.

Key Points

Landslide Challenges in Uttarakhand:

- **Landslides** occur regularly in the hill areas, especially during the <u>monsoon season</u>, causing roadblocks and inconveniences for **Chardham pilgrims**.
- These landslides often **result in loss of lives** and have long been a major concern.
- Persistent landslide zones on the <u>Gangotri</u> and <u>Yamunotri</u> highways have posed significant risks for years.
- Adoption of Australian Rock Bolt Technology:
 - The BRO is using Australian rock bolt technology to treat active landslide zones at **Raturisera and Bandarkot** on the Gangotri highway in Uttarkashi district.
 - Previously, the technology was successfully applied at Nalupani and Chungi Badethi landslide zones.
 - The technology has been instrumental in treating landslide zones active for years as part of the <u>Chardham road-widening project.</u>

- Effectiveness and Techniques:

- The technology has been 90% effective in preventing landslides.
- It **involves soil nailing to stabilize loose soil and rock bolting in bedrock** to strengthen vulnerable areas.

Border Roads Organisation (BRO)

- Established in 1960 with only two projects, Project Tusker (now Vartak) in the East and Project Beacon in North India, the BRO has grown to become a vibrant organisation with 18 projects operating in 11 States and three Union Territories.
 - It is now recognised as the leading infrastructure construction agency in high-altitude and difficult snow-bound areas.
- In 2023-24, the BRO completed 125 infrastructure projects, including the construction of <u>the Sela</u> <u>Tunnel in Arunachal Pradesh</u> on Balipara-Chardwar-Tawang Road.
 - The BRO will soon start construction on the 4.10-km long <u>Shinkun La Tunnel</u>, which will become the world's highest tunnel at 15,800 ft once completed, bypassing China's Mila Tunnel at 15,590 ft.
- The BRO is an Indian executive force under the Ministry of Defence, to secure India's borders and develop infrastructure in remote areas of the north and north-eastern states.
- It operates under the Border Roads Development Board (BRDB) and is responsible for road networks in border areas and neighbouring countries.
 - The motto of BRO is "Shramena Sarvam Sadhyam", which translates to "Everything is achievable through hard work."

Pilibhit Tiger Reserve | Uttar Pradesh | 10 Dec 2024

Why in News?

Recently, **a probe has been ordered** after a viral video surfaced, showing a fleet of vehicles allegedly belonging to a minister in Uttar Pradesh passing through the **core area** of the <u>Pilibhit Tiger Reserve</u>. This raised concerns about the <u>breach of forest regulations</u>.

Key Points

- As per forest department regulations, private vehicles are strictly barred from entering the core area, allowing access only to forest department vehicles or those authorized for safari tours.
- Pilibhit Tiger Reserve:
 - It is located in Pilibhit and Shahjahanpur district of Uttar Pradesh.
 - It was notified as a <u>Tiger Reserve</u> in 2014.
 - In 2020, it bagged <u>international award TX2</u> for doubling up the number of tigers in the past four years.
 - It forms part of Terai Arc Landscape in the upper Gangetic Plain.
 - The northern edge of the reserve lies along the Indo-Nepal border while the southern boundary is marked by the river Sharada and Khakra.
 - Flora and Fauna:
 - It is home to a habitat for over 127 animals, 326 bird species and 2,100 flowering plants.
 - Wild animals include **tiger**, <u>swamp deer, bengal florican</u>, <u>leopard</u>, etc.
 - It has high <u>sal forests</u>, plantations and grasslands with several water bodies.

Tiger Reserves

- A protected area designated for the conservation of the striped big cats (tigers) is referred to as Tiger Reserve. However, a tiger reserve may also be a national park or wildlife sanctuary.
 For Example: The Sariska Tiger Reserve is also a national park. It is so because the place
 - was originally created as a national park and later dedicated to tiger conservation.
- Tiger Reserves are notified by State Governments as per provisions of Section 38V of the <u>Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972</u> on advice of the <u>National Tiger Conservation Authority</u>.

TX2 Award

It goes to one site that has achieved remarkable and measurable increase in its tiger population since 2010.
