Why in News?

Recently, the Union Home Minister attended the **61st Raising Day function** of <u>Sashastra Seema Bal</u>(<u>SSB)</u> at **Siliquri** in West Bengal.

 He lauded the role of SSB in protecting the <u>Siliguri Corridor</u>, gateway to Northeast and Sikkim and surrounded by three International borders.

What is Sashastra Seema Bal (SSB)?

- About: SSB is a part of the <u>Central Armed Police Forces</u> (CAPF) and guards India's border with Nepal (1,751 km) and Bhutan (699 km).
 - It is one of the seven paramilitary forces in India (Others 6: <u>Assam Rifles</u>, <u>Border</u>
 <u>Security Force</u>, <u>Central Industrial Security Force</u>, <u>Central Reserve Police Force</u>,
 <u>Indo Tibetan Border Police</u> and <u>National Security Guard</u>.
- Formation: It was established as the Special Service Bureau in May 1963, in the aftermath of the Chinese aggression in 1962.
 - It comes under the aegis of the Ministry of Home Affairs.
- Recognition: SSB is the first central paramilitary force that included women in its ranks.
 - In March 2004, SSB was awarded the <u>President's Colours</u> for its key role in national security.
 - The President's Colours is the **highest honour** that can be bestowed upon any military unit.

CENTRAL ARMED POLICE FORCES (CAPF)

The CAPF includes the seven security forces in India functioning under the Ministry of Home Affairs.

Assam Rifles (AR)

- (9) Origin: 1835, as militia called 'Cachar Levy'
 - (i) Erstwhile objective: To protect British Tea estates
- (S) Current Objectives:
 - (i) Conducting anti-terrorist operations in NER
 - Ensuring security at India-China and India-Myanmar borders
- (5) Imp Role in:
 - Sino-India War 1962
 - Indian Peace Keeping Force (IPKF) to Sri Lanka (1987)

Due to long association with tribal belts, Assam Rifles are also called 'Friends of the North East'

Border Security Force (BSF)

- (9) Origin: 1965
- Objectives:
 - Securing land borders with Pakistan and Bangladesh
 - (i) Also performing Anti-Infiltration in Kashmir Valley
 - Counter Insurgency in NER
 - (i) Anti-Naxal Operations in Odisha and Chhattisgarh
- Wings: Air wing, marine wing, an artillery regiment, and commando units

BSF is India's First Line of Defence and the world's largest border guarding force

Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF)

- Pre-Independence Origin: 1939 (Crown Representative's Police)
- Post Independence: 1949 under CRPF Act, became Central Reserve Police Force
- Objective: Crowd control, riot control, counter militancy/insurgency operations, etc.

CRPF is the principle central police force for internal security

Indo-Tibetan Border Police (ITBP)

- (9) **Origin:** 1962
- Objectives:
 - Deployed on border from Karakoram Pass (Ladakh) to Jachep La (Arunachal Pradesh) (~3488 km of Indo-China Border)
 - Manning Border Outposts on altitudes
 9000 ft 18700 ft in Western, Middle and
 Eastern sectors of Indo-China Border

ITBP is India's specialised mountain force & the first responder to natural disasters

National Security Guard (NSG)

- Origin: 1984 (came into being in 1986), following
 Operation Blue Star
- Objectives: Counter-terrorism unit/Federal Contingency Force
- Task-oriented Force Two complementary elements:
 - ⊕ Special Action Group (SAG)
 - Special Ranger Groups (SRG)

Sashastra Seema Bal (SSB)

- (9) Origin: 1963
- Objectives:
 - Guarding Indo-Nepal and Indo-Bhutan borders
 - Enhance border security, curb trans-border crimes, prevent unauthorised entry/exit, halt smuggling, etc.

Central Industrial Security Force (CISF)

- Origin: Central Industrial Security Force Act, 1968
- Objectives: Ensuring security of major critical infrastructure installations

CISF is the sole CAPF unit with a specialised fire wing



What is Siliguri Corridor?

- About: The Siliguri Corridor is a narrow stretch of land, approximately 60 km long and 17-22 km wide. It is referred to as the 'Chicken Neck' due to its narrow shape.
- Location: Located between **Nepal, Bhutan, and Bangladesh**, it is the **only land link** between India and its northeastern states.
 - It is located in **West Bengal**.
- Importance: It plays a vital role in military logistics, offering key routes for road and railway

networks that facilitate the movement of armed forces.

 Non-access to Siliguri Corridor, would isolate India's northeastern region, severing supply lines and reinforcements.
