

## **CCI Imposes Fine on Meta**

Recently, the <u>Competition Commission of India (CCI)</u> imposed a penalty of Rs 213.14 crore on Meta for abusing its dominant position through <u>WhatsApp's 2021 privacy policy</u> update.

- This ruling prohibits WhatsApp from sharing user data with other Meta companies for advertising purposes and mandates that user consent must be obtained for any data sharing.
  - The CCI found that WhatsApp's 2021 policy update forced users to accept expanded data collection terms without an option to opt out, constituting an unfair condition under the <u>Competition Act.</u>
  - The new policy may enable commercial exploitation and political micro-targeting.
  - The ruling mandates WhatsApp to provide clear explanations regarding data-sharing practices, enhancing transparency for users.
- WhatsApp's policy also conflicts with the <u>Srikrishna Committee report</u>, which forms the basis of the <u>Data Protection Bill 2019</u>, including data localisation and <u>limiting</u> data use to its original purpose.
- The Competition Commission of India (CCI) is a statutory body responsible for enforcing the Competition Act of 2002.
