


# PM offering to Ajmer Sharif Dargah | Rajasthan | 03 Jan 2025

#### Why in News?

Recently, the Prime Minister **presented a 'chadar'** to Minorities Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju to **offer** at the **Ajmer Sharif Dargah** of **Sufi Saint Khwaja Moinuddin Chishti** on the occasion **of 'Urs'.** 

■ The Urs festival is an **annual festival** held at Ajmer in Rajasthan which **commemorates the death anniversary** of Sufi saint Moinuddin Chishti.

The Vision



- Khwaja Moinuddin Chishti:
  - Moinuddin Hasan Chishti was born in Sijistan (modern-day Sistan) in Iran in 1141-42
     CE.
  - After Muizuddin Muhammad bin Sam of Ghor had already defeated <u>Prithviraj Chauhan</u> in the <u>Second Battle of Tarain (1192)</u> and established his rule in Delhi, Khwaja <u>Moinuddin Chishti started living and preaching in Ajmer.</u>
  - His instructive discourses, full of spiritual insights, soon drew the local populace as well as kings and nobles and peasants and the poor from far and wide.

- His shrine in Ajmer has been visited by rulers like <u>Muhammad bin Tughlaq, Sher</u> Shah Suri, Akbar, Jahangir, Shah Jahan, Dara Shukoh and Aurangzeb.
- Chishti Order (Chishtiya):
  - Chishtiya Order was founded in India by Khwaja Moin-Uddin Chishti.
  - It emphasised the doctrine of the unity of being with God (waḥdat al-wujūd) and members of the order were also pacifists.
  - They **rejected all material goods** as distractions from the contemplation of God.
  - They abstained from connection with the <u>secular state</u>.
  - Recitation of the names of God, both aloud and silently (dhikr jahrī, dhikr khafī), formed the cornerstone of Chishtī practice.
  - The Chishty teachings were carried forward and popularized by disciples of Khwaja Moin-Uddin Chishti like Khwaja Qutbuddin Bakhtiyar Kaki, Fareeduddin Ganj-e-Shakar, Nizam uddin Auliya and Naseeruddin Charagh.

#### Sufism

- Sufism is a mystical form of Islam, a school of practice that focuses on the spiritual search for God and shuns materialism.
- It is a form of Islamic mysticism which **stresses on asceticism**. There is a lot of emphasis on devotion towards God.
- In Sufism, **self discipline** is considered an essential condition to gain knowledge of God by sense of perception.
- Unlike orthodox Muslims which emphasise on external conduct, the Sufis lay stress on inner purity. e Vision
- Sufis believe service to humanity is tantamount to service to God.

# Task Force for Gomti River Rejuvenation | Uttar Pradesh | 03 Jan 2025

#### Why in News?


Recently, the Territorial Army established a new task force dedicated to the rejuvenation and protection of the Gomti River, named Ganga Task Force (GTF).

- About GTF:
  - Objective and Focus:
    - The GTF aims to enhance environmental preservation and sustainable development.
    - Key responsibilities include <u>pollution</u> monitoring, riverbank and ghat patrolling, public awareness campaigns, and riverbank stabilization.
  - Composition:
    - The GTF primarily comprises ex-servicemen, reflecting the Territorial Army's tradition of utilizing experienced personnel for national missions.
  - - The formal raising ceremony occurred on 1<sup>st</sup> January 2025 at Lucknow Cantonment.
  - National Mission Alignment:
    - The GTF was established under the <u>National Mission for Clean Ganga</u>

(NMCG), an initiative of the Ministry of Jal Shakti.

- Orders for its creation were issued by the Ministry of Defence in September 2024.
- Significance:
  - This initiative reinforces the <u>Indian Army</u>'s role in nation-building and environmental sustainability.
  - The GTF aims to contribute significantly to the revitalization of the Gomti River and the broader <u>Clean Ganga Mission</u>.

#### **Gomti River**



- The Gomati River is a **tributary of the Ganga River** in central Uttar Pradesh.
- It originates east of Pilibhit, Uttar Pradesh.

- The Sai River, a right-bank tributary, joins the Gomati near Jaunpur.
- The Gomati River merges with the Ganges near Saidpur, Uttar Pradesh.

## 42nd Governor of Bihar | Bihar | 03 Jan 2025

#### Why in News?

Recently, Arif Mohammad Khan was sworn in as the 42<sup>nd</sup> Governor of Bihar.

- Oath Administration:
  - Patna High Court Chief Justice administered the oath at the Raj Bhawan.
  - The ceremony was attended by Chief Minister Nitish Kumar, his deputies, and Leader of Opposition.
- Governor:
  - The Governor's appointment, his powers and everything related to the office of Governor have been discussed under **Article 153 to Article 162 of the Indian Constitution**.
  - The role of the Governor is quite similar to that of the President of India. He stands
    as executive head of a State and under the Constitution of India, the governing
    machinery is the same as that of the Central Government.
  - It is stated that the Governor has a dual role.
    - He is the constitutional head of the state, bound by the advice of his council of ministers.
    - He functions as a vital link between the Union Government and the State Government.

### 10-minute Ambulance Service in Gurugram | Haryana | 03 Jan 2025

#### Why in News?

**Blinkit is launching a 10-minute ambulance service** in **Gurugram** and plans to expand it to other Indian cities within the next two years.

#### **Key Points**

- Medical Equipment and Staff:
  - Each ambulance is equipped with essential medical tools, including <u>oxygen cylinders</u>, Automated External Defibrillators (AED), stretchers, monitors, suction machines, emergency medicines, and injections.
    - The service does not provide neonatal or ventilator care.
  - The ambulance team consists of a paramedic, an assistant, and a trained driver.
- Service Launch and Accessibility:
  - · Initially, five ambulances will operate in Gurugram.
  - Users can book a **Basic Life Support (BLS)** ambulance through the Blinkit app.
- Affordability and Vision:
  - Blinkit aims to offer the service at an affordable fee of Rs 2,000.
  - The initiative focuses on solving a critical problem rather than profit-making.
